Each school review generates a number of key improvement strategies to inform continuous improvement in all state schools. The next steps are...

- Enhance the three levels of planning, ensuring that it reflects current systemic expectations, and aligns with and quality assures the delivery of all aspects of Australian Curriculum version 9.0.
- Enhance the culture of inquiry and innovation, ensuring all students are provided with an age-appropriate range of learning experiences that support creativity and independence.
- Build the capability of all staff to implement agreed approaches to the teaching of reading and writing, including the connection to curriculum, pedagogy and data analysis.
- Review the explicit improvement agenda, developing a sharp and narrow agenda that supports all staff and families to engage and enact it, leading to embedded practice.
